REUBEN

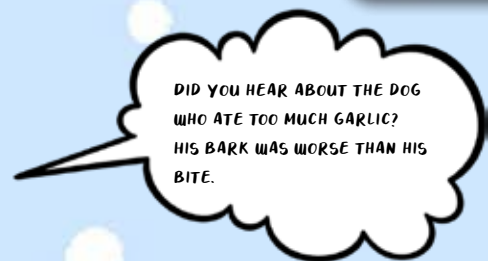
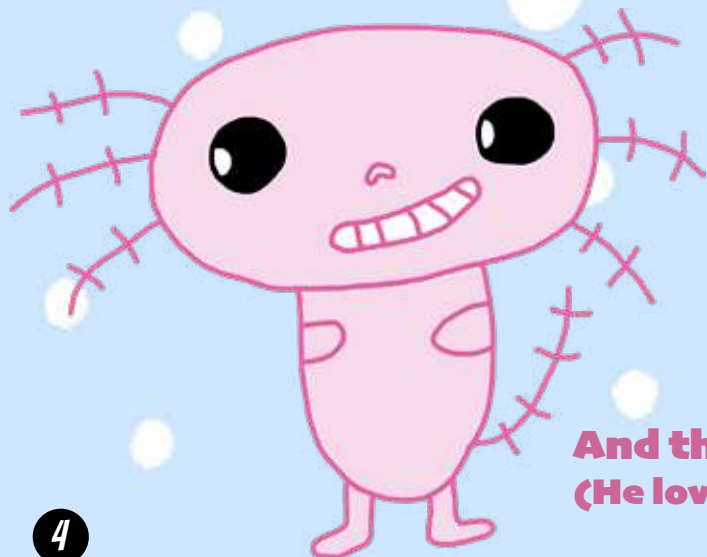

Behind the scenes

The Buzz team were given exclusive access behind the scenes at the Lighthouse Cinema and interviewed James who works there. Reuben reports: "The other day, we saw the new film Wish. Not only did we watch an amazing film, we got to see the projectors. After a few questions, and waving my hand to block the film, this is what we found out..."

How do you start the movie?

It's all on computers now so I just turn on the computer and press play! There's a pause button, a fast-forward button, just like at home. 99% of the time it works flawlessly, but of course sometimes it goes wrong and I have to come up and press play again.

What is the worst thing that people have left behind?

Once we had a nappy - a used nappy! But mostly just lots of coats and umbrellas.

Do you get to eat all the snacks?

Sometimes, but you do get bored of popcorn in the end. Kraxs are my favourite or Tango Iceblast.

When did the cinema open?

It opened here in 2011 but the WTW company has been running for around 78 years and they have 11 cinemas across Cornwall.

When did you start working here?

I started in the Truro cinema in 2003 but I've been here at the Lighthouse since it opened.

How many screens do you have here?

We have four screens, and Screen One has a stage so we often have live performances as well as films.

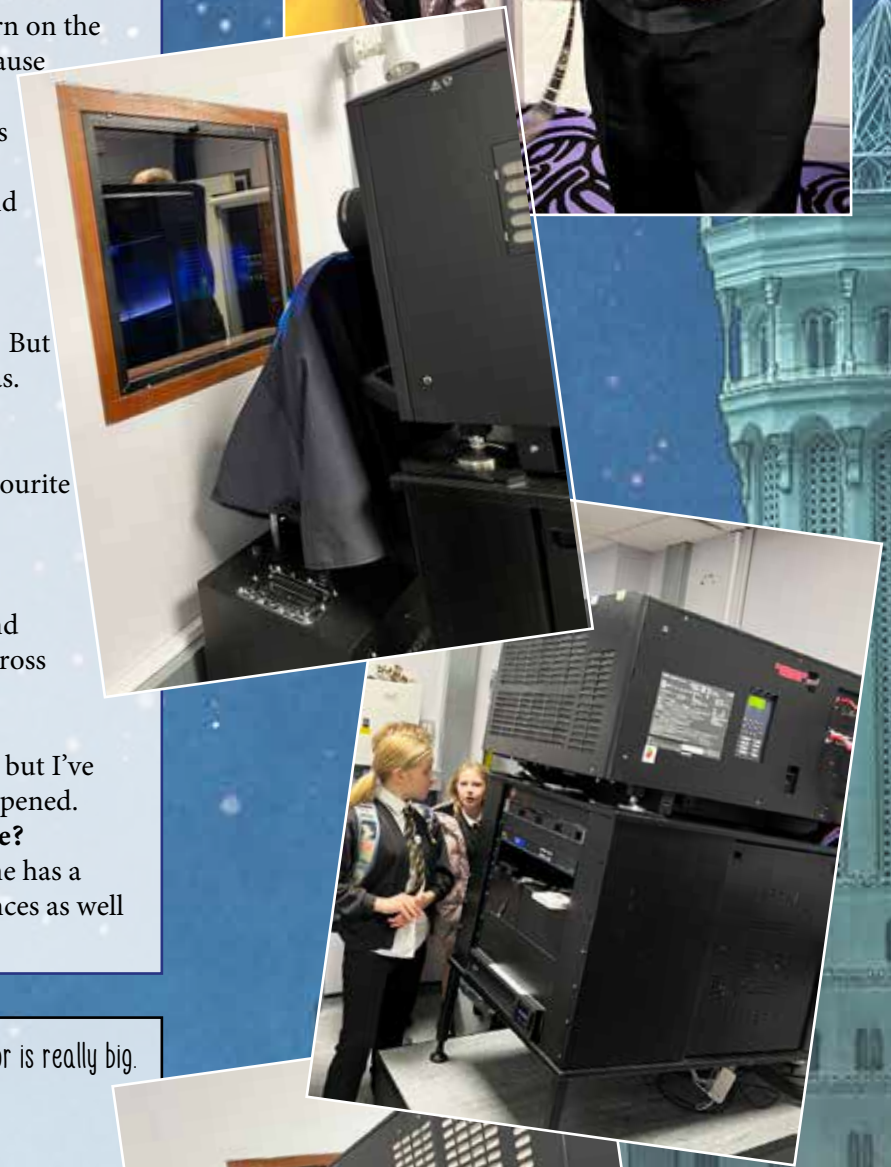
~ The room is really small but the projector is really big.

FESTIVE BAKING

With Lexi and Shayla

This issue we interviewed people for their favourite Christmas foods, and found some yummy food you can make at home in time for Christmas!

Christmas Cookies

Recipe

140g icing sugar, sieved
1 tsp vanilla extract
1 egg yolk
250g butter, cut into small cubes
375g plain flour, sieved
TO DECORATE:
200g icing sugar
Food colouring (optional)
Decorations (optional)

Method

~ Tip the icing sugar, vanilla extract, egg yolk and butter into a mixing bowl, then stir together with a wooden spoon (or pulse in a food processor until well combined).
~ Add the flour and mix to a firm dough.
~ Shape the dough into two flat discs and wrap them.
~ Chill for 20-30 mins.
~ Heat oven to 190C/fan 170C/gas 5 and line two baking sheets with non-stick baking paper.
~ Roll out the dough on a lightly floured surface to about the thickness of two £1 coins.
~ Cut out Christmassy shapes (use a cutter if you like) and place on the baking sheets.
~ Bake for 10-12 mins until lightly golden.
~ Lift the biscuits onto a wire rack to cool.
~ Meanwhile, mix the icing sugar with a few drops of cold water to make a thick, but still runny icing.
~ Colour with food colouring, if you like.
~ Spread it over the cooled biscuits and decorate as you like with sprinkles, silver balls or sweets.

Gingerbread Men

Recipe

225g plain flour, plus extra for dusting
75g unsalted butter
100g soft brown sugar
100g golden syrup
2tsp bicarbonate of soda
2tsp ground ginger
1tsp cinnamon
Salt

Method

Heat oven to 190C/170C fan/gas 5 and line a baking tray with baking parchment.
Sieve the flour, salt, bicarb, ginger and cinnamon into a large bowl.
Heat the butter, sugar and syrup until dissolved.
Leave the sugar mixture to cool slightly, then mix into the dry ingredients to form a dough.
On a surface lightly dusted with flour, roll out the dough to a ¼-inch thickness.
Stamp out the gingerbread men shapes with a cutter, then re-roll any off-cuts and repeat.
Place your gingerbread shapes on the lined trays, allowing space for them to spread.
Cook for 10-15 mins, then remove from the oven and leave to cool.

Mince Pies

Recipe

1 large jar mincemeat (around 600g)
2 satsumas, segmented and finely chopped
1 apple, finely chopped
Zest of 1 lemon
A little icing sugar for dusting
FOR THE PASTRY:
375g plain flour
260g unsalted butter, softened
125g caster sugar, plus extra for sprinkling
1 large egg plus 1 beaten egg for glazing

Method

Place 375g plain flour and 260g softened unsalted butter in a bowl and rub together to a crumb consistency. Add 125g caster sugar and 1 large beaten egg, and mix together. Tip out onto a lightly floured surface and fold until the pastry comes together, be careful not to over mix.
Wrap the pastry in cling film and chill for 10 mins.
Scoop the large jar of mincemeat into a bowl and add 2 segmented satsumas, 1 finely chopped apple and zest of 1 lemon.
Heat oven to 220C/200C fan/gas 7.
Roll out the pastry to 3mm thick.
Using a round cutter (about 10cm), cut out 16 bases and place them into muffin trays.
Put 1½ tbsp mincemeat mixture into each.
Brush the edge of each pie with a little beaten egg.
Re-roll out the pastry to cut 7cm lids and press them on top to seal.
Glaze with the beaten egg, sprinkle with the extra caster sugar, then make a small cut in the tops.
Bake the mince pies for 15-20 mins until golden brown.
Leave to cool before releasing them from the muffin trays and dusting with a little more icing sugar before serving.

Mini Bakewell Tarts

Recipe

2 x 320g sheets of all butter shortcrust pastry
FOR THE FRANGIPANE:
120g butter, softened
120g golden caster sugar
1 egg
1tbsp plain flour
110g ground almonds
90g cherry jam
FOR THE ICING:
200g icing sugar
12 glacé cherries

Method

Heat the oven to 180C/160C fan/gas 4.
Lightly butter a 12-hole muffin tin.
Unroll the sheet of pastry and use a 10cm circular pastry cutter to cut 12 circles out of the pastry sheet.
Press the cut circles into the holes of the tin, making sure they come right up and slightly over the top – pushing out any creases.
Chill the pastry in the fridge for 20mins.
Scrunch up 10cm x 10cm squares of baking paper and then un-scrunch and use to line each of the pastry tarts, then fill with baking beans, rice or dried pulses.
Bake for 10 mins, then remove the paper and beans and bake for 10 mins longer, until golden brown.
Set aside to cool a little.
Make the filling by beating together the butter and sugar until light and fluffy, then whisk in the egg, followed by the flour (the flour will prevent the mixture from splitting).
Fold in the ground almonds.
Spoon a level tsp of cherry jam into each of the pastry shells, followed by a tablespoon of the frangipane mixture.
Bake for 20 mins, until the frangipane is golden and springy.
Set aside to cool completely.
Neaten the edges of the pastry with a small knife or scissors.
Mix the icing sugar with 2 tbsp water.
Spread the icing over each of the tarts, top each with a glacé cherry, leave to set for 20 mins, then serve with tea.

4. Now cut them out and colour and stick them on the ring.
5. Poke a hole in the top using a pencil and thread string through it.
6. Finally add bling.

Things you will need:

- Two pieces of paper
- Glue

Step by step

1. First fold your paper forwards and backwards until you get to the end. Do this with both pieces.
2. Take one piece and fold in half, then glue the inside edges. Do the same with the other piece.
3. Now take both pieces and glue them together then fan it out.
4. Finally add some bling and stickers to make your masterpiece pop.

Things you will need:

- Cotton balls
- 4 sheets of paper
- 1 black felt tip pen

Step by step

1. First, cut out Santa's details such as his eyes, nose, hat and beard. Draw 25 circles on his big beard.

~ Surfers can ride waves standing, kneeling or lying down.

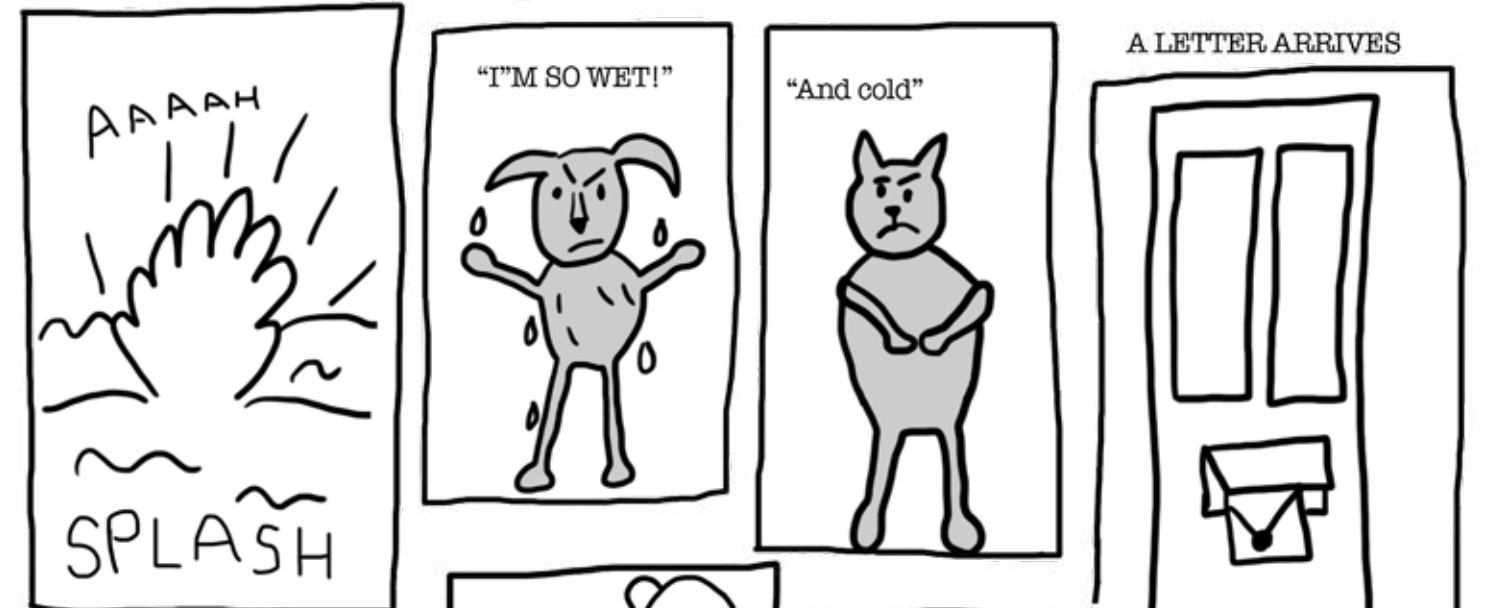
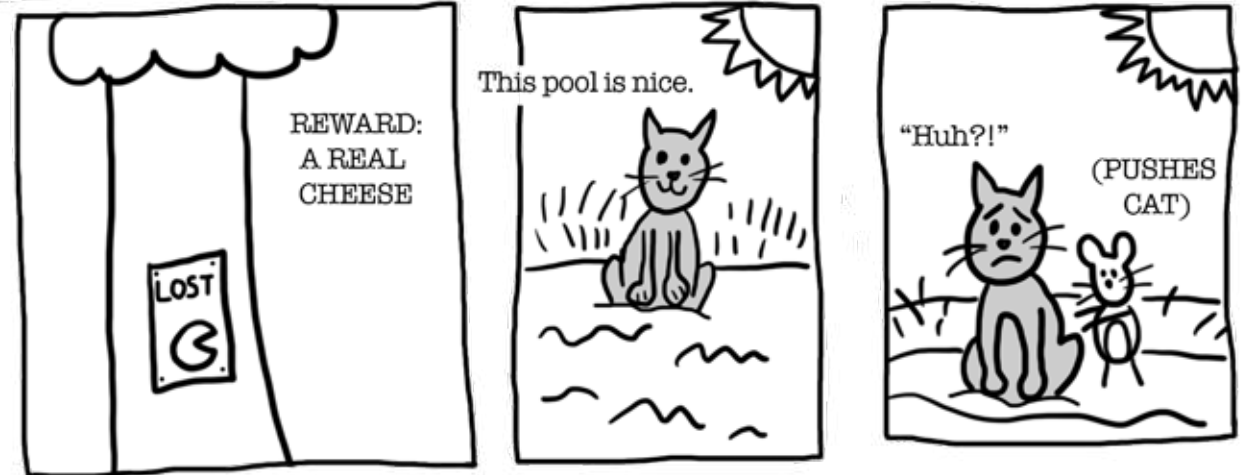
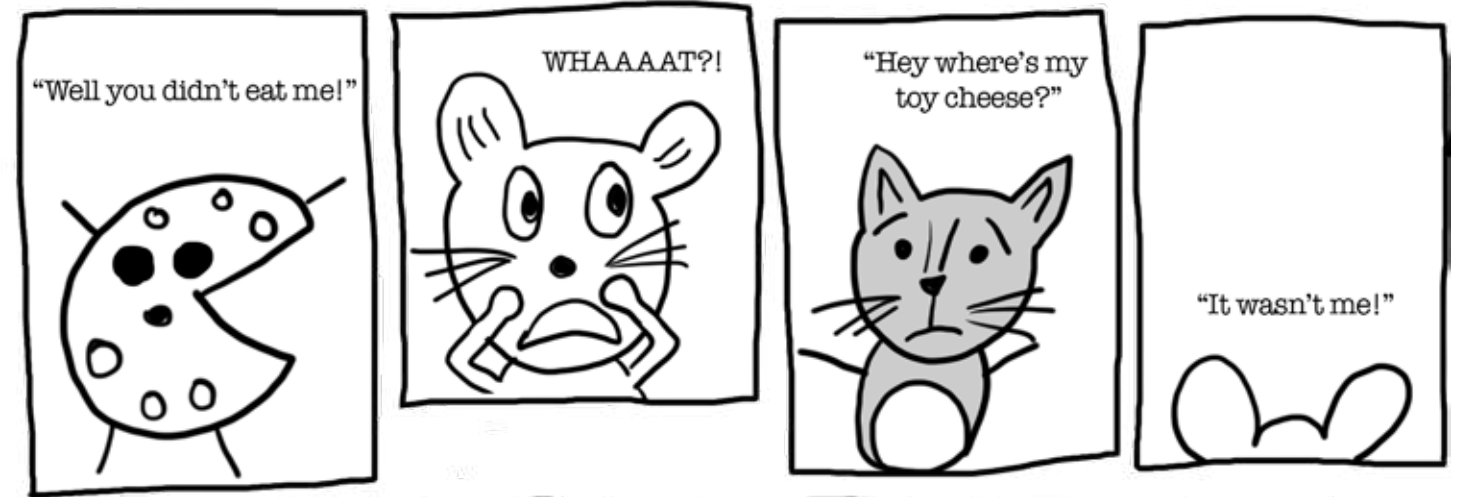
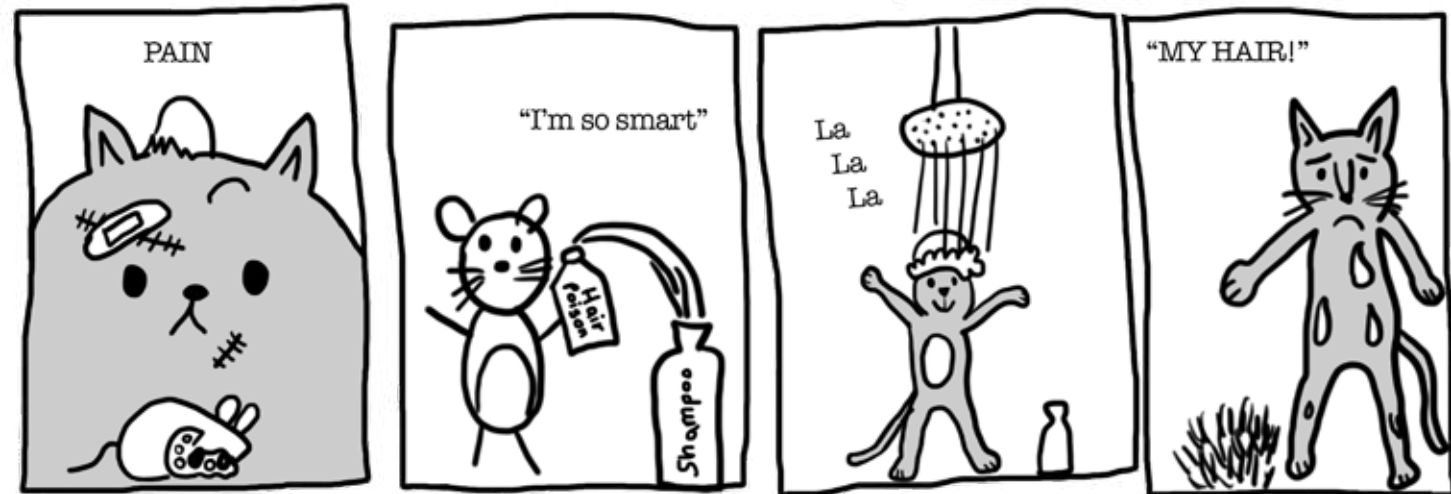
